



Synodon Awarded Canadian Innovation Commercialization Program (CICP) Contract

Edmonton, Alberta – July 14, 2011 - Synodon Inc. ("Synodon") [TSXV-SYD], is pleased to announce a contract award, valued at \$350,000, from the Canadian Innovation Commercialization Program (CICP). The award was announced in Calgary today by Honourable Rona Ambrose, Minister of Public Works and Government Services Canada and Minister for Status of Women, at a public event showcasing Synodon's realSens™ technology.

Through this program, Public Works and Government Services Canada will procure realSens™ remote sensing survey services to detect and measure naturally occurring methane seeps in the Canadian Arctic. The project will expand on a successful small scale survey completed in 2009 in conjunction with Natural Resources Canada and will test the technology's ability to remotely survey large areas of the Arctic.

Researchers at Natural Resources Canada have been studying natural releases of methane gas in the Mackenzie delta area for several years documenting their widespread occurrence and possible association with conventional gas fields and gas hydrates which occur beneath a thick permafrost interval. The research of these seeps is difficult, requiring costly field campaigns with scientists working on foot and covering small areas. There are currently no remote sensing technologies that allow for large area gas monitoring or surveillance in the Arctic and the realSens™ technology intends to provide this capability.

Synodon Inc. (www.synodon.com) is an Edmonton based technology company which has developed and demonstrated an advanced airborne remote gas sensing system called *realSens*™, based on technologies developed under the Canadian Space Program and by Synodon scientists. The company provides a full service gas emissions monitoring and quantification service to a variety of industries, including hydrocarbon (oil and gas), environmental, agricultural and for a variety of gases including methane, ethane and ammonia. The initial focus is on the hydrocarbon industry and in particular the natural gas pipeline sector.
